Following the Acorn

Traversing Hadrian's Wall

This year the McElroy family made a commitment to go on airplane mode for a week and traverse the 84-mile Hadrian's Wall Path in Northern England. This is an overview of that wonderful adventure.

As an AREA member you're a successful REALTOR® who is involved in the community and various real estate associations. Clients and colleagues rely upon you as a trusted advisor and advocate, so to truly get away from work is difficult. What is it like to turn your cell phone off and journey back in history?

Hadrian's Roman Wall with adjoining military forts (c.122 AD) is a UNESCO World Heritage site located between England and Scotland, stretching from the Irish Sea to the North



Sea. Our family trained all summer for the physicality of trekking the wall in its entirety. The actual experience became an exercise in releasing business (AKA busy-ness), focusing on the beauty of the moment and immersing ourselves in Roman British history.

After a short flight from Dublin to Newcastle upon Tyne, our journey began. Day 1 we walked the city and explored museums, Roman ruins, & historic sites. From Day 2 onward we navigated varying terrain in the English countryside, averaging 12 miles daily. Having nothing scheduled except nightly accommodations in tiny villages, the pace was slow as we stopped frequently to capture "Kodak moments". We experienced every minute and every second of the Hadrian's Wall Path and its surround, step after step over rolling moorlands, through cow and sheep pastures, on top of crags,

and amidst forests. No cars or phone calls. No cities or traffic.

A scallop shell is the symbol of the Camino de Santiago Christian pilgrimage route in Spain. Metaphorically it represents different paths leading to one destination. Although

walking Hadrian's Wall Path is not a religious pilgrimage, an acorn is the official and equally meaningful icon seen on directional signs along the way. In its dormant state as a seed, the acorn reminds us that respite is important for future growth and potential. What a perfect symbol for a memorable journey!
